### Here Is My Heart—I'm Just Glad You're Here

Here is My heart, and this same heart is a part of you. Remember when I said the fast would go faster and the slow would go slower? And this has been so. And remember also when it was said to leave those who are slowing down in My hands? Many have done just that and I am pleased. I know for some this has not been easy. Now, one more thing—guard the heart.

Guard your heart, for out of it flows the things of My life, and My life is love. Be careful that no scorn or disdain is allowed in for the slow going slower, for you know not the desires in those hearts that struggle with the stronger pull of the flesh that they have not yet gotten in check. The enemy would like to come in with a disdain and with scornful attitudes, and these are not found in My life within you. Guard yourself from these things, and let My compassion and wisdom rule.

Many who have left the fast track will return, and I ask that you keep a place in your heart for them as I do. Let your heart say the same thing that I do—"I'm just glad you're here." The doors of My heart are always open, and I expect the same of you.

Many in My Body go slow and think they go fast, but their hand is holding onto Me and never letting go. Hold onto them on My behalf and strengthen them through your prayers. I look for avenues to come in through each of you. Your authority is needed.

Don't disdain the slow, instead let your hearts begin to see them through My eyes—the eyes of a Father looking for the return of those who have strayed, and ready at every moment to encourage those who have slowed their pace. I look; I wait; I love—ever ready to say, "I'm just glad you are here."
