Dear Friend,

As born-again believers, the devil doesn't want us to find out how free God has made us by His grace. That's why he likes to keep us focused on where we fall short. But we don't have to let the devil win at his game of condemnation. There is something we can do to live in the freedom Satan is trying so hard to keep us from enjoying.

The best way to walk free from condemnation is to fellowship daily with God—to pray, worship, and speak His Word over our lives. We'll save ourselves a lot of time and emotional turmoil if we'll turn to our Father in intimate fellowship. Fellowship with God brings us to the place where we learn to believe what He has done for us is **REAL** and **FINAL**. We can leave our daily fellowship with Him edified in truth and stronger in hope as we get glimpses of His goodness and of the path He has made available to us.

Of course, the devil won't let us reach that place in God without a fight, and neither will our flesh. Let's use an example of a man who decided to spend time in private worship until he defeated certain strongholds that caused him to feel intimidated and incomplete.

Every day as this man entered into worship with God, the enemy fought him like crazy. But many hours and days later of private worship, those negative things inside of him that had adversely affected his character, faith, and marriage had died, causing such a great change for the good that even his wife had to ask, "Who is this man?"

You see, this man decided to enter into fellowship with God through private worship to break the chains of wrong believing that had him bound. He chose to fight the hard war with the enemy rather than dragging out the process and allowing the devil to fill up his life with more guilt and condemnation.

The devil's ultimate goal is to trick Christians into expending our energy in a direction that doesn't deliver us to where God wants us to go. But as children of God, we need to understand that when we make time in our lives to spend with our Father and we press past things in us that want to stop us from spending that time with Him, we are putting ourselves on a sure path into victories in God.

Let's say you pray an hour or several hours in tongues. The devil whispers to your mind, *You aren't going to get anything because you didn't pray long enough.*

You fast for a day. *You're not going to get anything because you didn't fast three days.* You confess the Word for twenty minutes. *You're not through. You need to confess the Word for at least thirty minutes.*

"Well, I was going to do it for twenty minutes." *No, you have to do it for at least thirty!* The devil has a way of getting to you. He tries to put "growing in your relationship with God" so far out of reach that you just give up because no matter

what you do, it's never enough. But please remember: The devil is a liar, and that is all he is.

As we're setting aside time to spend with the Lord—sharing our heart with Him, reading the Word, praying in tongues, worshiping Him, fasting—the enemy wants us always thinking it's never enough.

God loves us. He is not penalizing us for what we're **NOT** giving Him. He is rewarding us for what we **ARE** giving.

How many times has the devil pulled this one on you? You say, "I'm going to get up early every morning to worship and pray in tongues." Then you miss a morning, and everything goes wrong that day. You say, "Sure enough—I knew it. I missed prayer this morning and everything fell apart."

The devil whispers, *That's right. Don't you ever fall out of prayer like that again! Otherwise, everything is going to go wrong.*

It doesn't take long before you miss another morning of prayer. You now have more condemnation than you have faith.

But what does God think about this situation? He loves every minute that you give Him! And don't think for a moment that God is so small-minded that He would refuse to move on your behalf in the afternoon because something happened in the morning to cause you to miss your time of prayer! Just remember: Whatever your situation and schedule, keep working towards being consistent and faithful in your fellowship with God. He doesn't just fellowship with the amount of time you set aside to spend with Him. He fellowships with the permanent change that takes place within you as you spend time with Him and obey His leading.

Sometimes when you pray, you might find there is nothing but dryness—dry tongues, dry worship, dry Word, and you wonder, *Is anybody out there?* But your walk with God isn't gauged by your emotions and what you feel or don't feel.

Our walk with God is to learn to be led by our spirit and not by our soul.

As we learn consistency and endurance in prayer and worship, in fasting, and in meditating on and confessing the Word, the areas of our life that are taking precedence over spending time in God's Presence will eventually have to give way as our mind is renewed to the truth through our fellowship with Him.

Jesus said that we can say to any mountain in our lives, "Be cast into the sea," and if we doubt not in our hearts, it will be done (Mark 11:23). Whenever we do what Jesus said to do, He is there doing what He said He would do. So our problem isn't the lack of power or the need to get God to do something. What God needed to do, He has already done. Therefore, we need to get our souls in agreement with God and His truth. This is where worship and speaking the Word come in, which is what the Apostle Paul says in Ephesians 5:19,20:

**Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord;
Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ;**

The more we obey this scripture, the more we will begin to believe God's Word and the more we will learn to trust Him. However, our mind isn't suddenly transformed the moment we stand up and say, "Today I have decided to change." Transformation is a process. That's why Paul said in Romans 12:2: **And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.**

This transformation process takes place as our mind is renewed through our fellowship with God in prayer and worship, in the meditation and assimilation of His Word, in speaking His Word.

Our soul has so much power that it will transform us to whatever we subject it to the most. That's why we cannot keep spending time with God, worshiping Him and calling something "DONE" without our circumstances eventually lining up with the Word. What Jesus called "believing with your heart" in Mark 11:23 will eventually take place inside of us, and when it does, the Holy Spirit is able to step in and move that mountain.

"But why is there often a waiting period before my mountain has to move?" If the mountain isn't moving, the problem doesn't lie with God. God's power has never broken down. He doesn't choose to delay the answer. He hates to see even one of us suffer while we're maturing in our faith. He HATES it.

"Well, how do I get God to move then?"

We don't have to worry about getting God to move. Our walk in God is to keep moving forward in faith by continuing in fellowship with Him until we BELIEVE His Word, because everything He has already said, He has done.

God's nature in you is hidden within an earthen vessel, and that vessel—your natural body—has been trained in the sense realm to only believe what he can see, hear, smell, taste, or feel. But now you belong to another Kingdom, and fellowship with God has everything to do with learning about Him, getting to know Him and trusting Him, learning who you are in Him and how to operate in His Kingdom.

We can't spend hours praying in the Spirit, worshiping in God's Presence, reading and meditating on the Word, and speaking what His Word says about us without our soul eventually lining up and believing what God has said.

Our soul has such a capacity for detail. What would that capacity do for us if we put it to work using the keys of fellowship and transformation in our own circumstances? Are we moving God by worshiping and thanking Him and confessing the Word? No, we are moving ourselves into the place where we start believing truth. And when we believe God, it frees Him to do things for us that our unbelief has kept us from receiving.

Through the ages, there have been individuals who have developed personal, intimate relationships with God to varying degrees, and the truths they learned allowed the Holy Spirit to work through them, even changing the outcome of nations and causing the reformation of entire generations.

Spending time with God is allowing the Holy Spirit to put us through His “school.” And as we take time with God, getting to know Him, learning about Him, and growing in faithfulness in our life in Him, the day will come when we reach those places of peace where mountains that wouldn’t budge before now begin to move, and the hold that condemnation had over us begins to loosen until those lies hold us no longer! And our fellowship with God has everything to do with getting us to that place.

As we continue in fellowship with God—not by the requirements of condemnation but simply because we are choosing to exercise our faith to spend time with Him—we know that by getting to know Him and growing in Him, we will see many victories with Him. And as we continue, the victories will begin to come more easily as we seek to know Him more through our times of fellowship with Him.

The voice of condemnation is never from our Father, ever. He is the One who is very pleased when we choose to spend time with Him. And when we struggle or fail yet turn to Him to fellowship with Him again, He is the One waiting with open arms, welcoming us as we continue getting to know Him and His ways.

You have a Father who loves you and believes in you. And we believe in you too!
